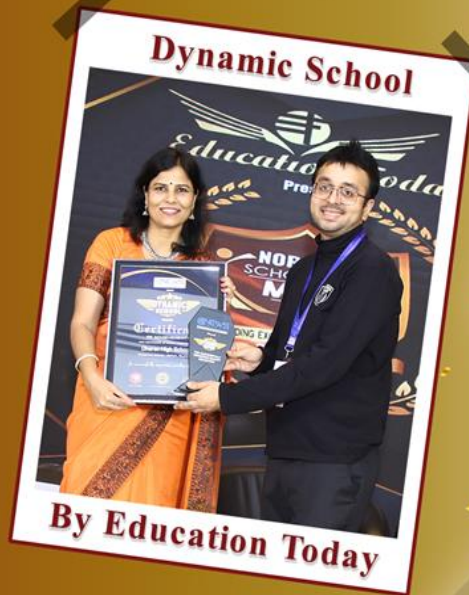

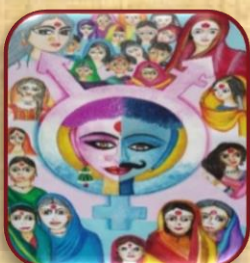


वाद-विवाद प्रतियोगिता
